DEAR NACOGDOCHES COUNTY CITIZENS AND OTHER INTERESTED SHAREHOLDERS,

We proudly present Nacogdoches County's Popular Annual Financial Report (PAFR) for fiscal year ended September 30, 2023. The PAFR, while not a substitute for the Annual Comprehensive Financial Report (ACFR), presents a less technical, more user-friendly report of the county's finances as well as other important county data.

The 2023 ACFR, which this PAFR summarizes, was audited by Whitley Penn LLP. It received an "Unmodified Opinion" meaning that the ACFR's statements fairly represent the financial condition of Nacogdoches County for fiscal year 2023.

This report does not necessarily conform to Generally Accepted Accounting Principles (GAAP), as it does not include custodial funds and certain special revenue funds. It is not issued a separate opinion; however, it does meet the Government Finance Officers Association (GFOA) standards.

The total levy is the amount of taxes to be received from the calculation of Net Property. (Tax values) x (the total tax rate per \$100) = Levy





Protecting Those That Protect Us

Bullet Resistant Shields

The County was awarded the Office of the Governor, Public Safety Office, Criminal Justice Division Bullet-Resistant Shield Grant which will allow the Sheriff's Office to purchase 28 bullet resistant shields. These shields will be equipped in each of the Sheriff's Office patrol vehicles and each eligible county school district. The shields are capable of stopping the majority of handgun and rifle rounds, making them a valuable investment in keeping not only our deputies safe, but also provide support to the officers protecting our students as well.

Juvenile Probation Relocates

The Juvenile Probation Department moved locations in September. The office moved to 621 Harris Street which was the former location of the Nacogdoches Senior Center. After some new paint and minimal renovations, Juvenile Probation has additional space for offices and for teaching life skills for the juveniles within this program. The move also allows for possible expansion of services as needed by Nacogdoches County juveniles in the future.

The Texas Millionaire

Frost Thorne was born in Glen Cove New York in 1793, moving to Texas in 1825 upon obtaining an empresario contract from the Mexican government. Upon arriving in Texas, he dropped the "e" from his name. He lived the rest of his life in Nacogdoches where he was a shop keeper, trader, land owner, banker, and several other businesses. He is considered to be the first Texas millionaire, and it wasn't from oil.

Situated on the El Camino Real, Thorn would trade in horses, saddles, whiskey and any other supplies that would be needed by travelers, adventurers and anyone else passing through the area. His ledger records the day Sam Houston arrived in Texas and that the first thing the future president of Texas purchased was a drink of whiskey.

Thorn would trade with the local indigenous tribes, buying deer skins and beef hides. He would then turn the hides over to the tanner to create quality goods to be sold in this store; supply chain management more than 100 years before the term was coined.

By 1854 at his death, Thorn owned property in every county in Texas. The properties were considered large and would be at least a league (generally accepted as 3 statute miles). Thorn provided a one-stop shop, helping customers fill out the paperwork so he could trade for their land.

Thorn and his wife also believed in contributing to their community. They donated land for church sites, served on the state legislature of Coahuila and Texas, he aided in the establishment of the University of Nacogdoches. He served on the board of health of Nacogdoches, he was an active Mason from the Milam Lodge, he was Chairman of the Nacogdoches Committee of vigilance and safety during the Texas Revolution, and was a trustee at the University—along with assisting Stephen Austin in getting colonists to Texas.

Their home in Nacogdoches was donated to Mrs. Thorn's sister, Mrs. Sarah Davenport. The large home was converted into the Hart Hotel and was located on the site of the Mize Department Store.

Mr. Thorn died on December 3, 1854 and was interred at the historical Oak Grove Cemetery.
