ORDER DECLARING RESULT OF SCHOOL CONSOLIDATION ELECTION

STATE OF TEXAS  
COUNTY OF NACOGDOCHES

At a regular term of the Commissioners' Court of Nacogdoches County, Texas, on the 12 day of May, A. D., 1947, came on to be heard and considered the returns of the elections held on the 3rd day of May, 1947, in each of the following School Districts of Nacogdoches County, to wit: Spring Hill Common School District Number 31 and Martinsville Consolidated Common School District Number 16, both of which is in Nacogdoches County, Texas, upon the question of consolidating the aforementioned contiguous school districts and school purposes, there by forming the Martinsville Consolidated Common School District Number 16, in Nacogdoches County, Texas.

And it appearing to the Court that said election, and each of them herein, in all respects were legally held; that said returns were duly and legally made, and that said returns show that a majority of the votes cast at each of said elections favored the consolidation, towit: That at the election at Spring Hill Common School District Number 31 there were cast 17 votes, of which number were cast for the consolidation 8 votes and of which number were cast against the consolidation 9 votes, and that the election in the Martinsville Consolidated Common School District Number 16 in Nacogdoches County, Texas, there were cast 11 votes of which number there were cast for the consolidation 10 votes and against the consolidation 1 vote.

THEREFORE, the Honorable Commissioners' Court in McCogdoches County, Texas, in a regular session as aforesaid, having fully examined into the manner on holding said election and results thereof, does hereby declare the proposition for the consolidation of said school districts for school purposes in all things <sup>defeated.</sup> ~~adapted~~, and the ~~Martinsville Consolidated Common School District Number 16 is duly and legally created as of this date, and the metes and bounds of said Martinsville Consolidated Common School District Number 16 are from this date to be composed of the combined metes and bounds of the said Martinsville Consolidated Common School District Number 16 and Spring Hill Common School District Number 31 as they have heretofore been duly and legally established.~~

ORDER OF COMMISSIONERS' COURT OF NACOGDOCHES COUNTY,  
TEXAS, CANVASSING RETURN OF ELECTION.

STATE OF TEXAS

COUNTY OF NACOGDOCHES

At a regular session of the Commissioners' Court of Nacogdoches County, Texas, held at the Court House in Nacogdoches, Texas, on the 12 day of May, A.D. 1947, there came on for attention of the Court the canvass of two elections simultaneously held, as hereinafter set out, in sections (a) and (b) below. All of the commissioners of said Court being present, and the Court having carefully checked and canvassed said elections and the reports of said elections made and returned by the proper and legally appointed officers theretofore appointed to hold said elections, and the Commissioners' Court having counted the ballots of said elections and each and all of them, find and declare the following results of each of the elections, to-wit:

- (a) At the election held at Pine Hill Common School District No. 32 on the 26th day of April, A.D. 1947, to determine whether or not said Pine Hill Common School District should be consolidated with Garrison Independent School District for school purposes, thereby forming Garrison Independent School District, there were 87 total votes cast and of such votes there were 87 votes cast "FOR CONSOLIDATION", and 0 votes cast "AGAINST CONSOLIDATION".
- (b) At the election held in Garrison Independent School District on the 26th day of April, A.D. 1947, to determine whether or not Garrison Independent School District should be consolidated with Pine Hill Common School District No. 32, for school purposes, thereby forming Garrison Independent School District, there were 11 total votes cast, and of such votes there were 10 votes cast "FOR CONSOLIDATION", and 1 vote cast "AGAINST CONSOLIDATION."

It appears to the Commissioners' Court, and said Court finds that said elections, and each of them, carried, and in each of them a majority of the legally qualified voters of each district cast their ballots for consolidation, it is hereby declared by the Commissioners' Court that said elections, and each of them, did carry, and that each of said elections resulted in favor of the consolidation of said school districts for school purposes, thereby forming Garrison Independent School District.

It is, therefore, the Order, Judgment and Decree of the Commissioners' Court that Pine Hill Common School District No. 32 be and the same is hereby consolidated with Garrison Independent School District, both of said districts being wholly located in Nacogdoches County, Texas, thereby forming Garrison Independent School District for all school purposes, as provided by law, for the consolidation of such districts, and that the name of the new district be "GARRISON INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT", and that the boundaries of Garrison Independent School District be the boundaries of said district prior to said election plus the area constituting Pine Hill Common School District No. 32.

IT IS SO FOUND, ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED this 12 day of May, A.D. 1947.
